What is publicly funded prekindergarten education? Publicly funded prekindergarten education is defined as 10 hours per week of developmentally appropriate learning experiences using curriculum based on Vermont's Early Learning Standards. Publicly funded pre-kindergarten education is limited to the academic year (September-June for 35 weeks).

Is my child eligible for publicly funded prekindergarten? Your child is eligible if your child resides in Springfield, is between the ages of 3-5, and turns 3 before September 1, 2018 and is not age eligible for kindergarten.
